Michael Jackson—The Beer Hunter

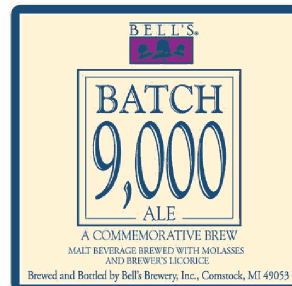

The varied styles of the great brewing nations were being squashed by light lagers. Mr. Jackson was instrumental in turning the industry around and a new generation of American brewers have come along to carry the torch.

As a matter of fact, one of the featured beers, Avery Hog Heaven was one of Mr. Jackson's favorites. According to Adam Avery, "...a keg of fresh Hog Heaven would be VERY appropriate as Michael LOVED that beer. As a matter of fact, we owe him big time as he championed Hog as a judge at the GABF a few years ago. We were told that he would NOT let Hog not medal.
